Physical Education

The current 8th grade class (Class of 2019) will have the opportunity to be exempted from HS PE class if they successfully complete two seasons of high school sports, cheerleading, or marching band. Students exempting PE class must take an addition 0.5 credit of elective coursework to meet their HS graduation requirements. Additional information regarding the PE waiver can be found on the HS website or in the Guidance Office.

Graduation Updates

There are now multiple pathways to graduation for students in the Class of 2018 and beyond. They are:

1. Score 18 points on the End-of-Course Exams. The exams are: Algebra I, Geometry, Biology, American History, American Government, English I, and English II
2. Students earn an Industry recognized credential and achieve a workforce readiness score
3. Earn a remediation free score in English and math on the ACT.
