



The annual state testing season is upon us. Our students will have an opportunity to demonstrate their academic abilities via **The American Institutes for Research (AIR)** tests in math, English, science and social studies. Our staff has been implementing a year-long game plan that includes creative lessons based on content standards, interventions and assessments. Our students demonstrated their talents by responding to each educational challenge set forth by their teachers. We need a total team effort in order to meet our goal of continued Excellence! Attached is the schedule for each test in each grade. Please be sure to make note of the dates your child will be testing. Below are some test-taking tips for parents and students.

Parents: The Night Before Testing

1. Children should go to bed at their normal time.
2. Solve any family/friend problems before the testing dates.
3. Talk to your child about any concerns that he/she might have about the test.

Students: Testing Day

1. Start your day as normal.
2. Eat a good breakfast.
3. Think of what you will do to relax after you get home from school.
4. Think positive and be confident in your abilities!

Students: Multiple Choice Questions Recommendations

1. If you do not understand the directions, ask for help.
2. Read the question and ***all*** answer choices ***before*** marking anything.
3. If you can eliminate wrong answers, your chance of choosing the right answer is greater.
4. If you finish early, check to make sure you have answered all questions.

Students: Extended- Response/Short Answer Recommendations

1. Read the question ***carefully*** and ***completely***. ***How many parts of the question are there?***
2. Highlight the point value of the question.
3. Underline or highlight ***Key*** or ***Power Words*** – Key words and what they are asking you to do.
4. Restate the question – Repeat part of the question in your answer – Use a sentence to answer each part of the question- Explain or justify with evidence.
5. Check your answer to see if it makes sense and that you answered what the question was actually asking.

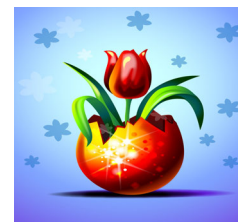
