

ELA THIRD GRADE TESTING!

Ohio Department of Education Testing Dates and the yearly testing programs are going forward as scheduled. All 3rd grade students in the state of Ohio are required by law to complete the Fall ELA testing.

The window for testing is October 19th to October 30th and must be completed within a window of 5 consecutive days. We will begin our testing on October 19th. If your 3rd grade student is 100% remote, they must be scheduled to come into the school to complete the state testing. We will be doing this much in the same way as we have been scheduling the diagnostics.

Please be aware that this is a required test by law and all students must complete the test within the testing window. All students should prepare for the testing by getting adequate sleep the night before, eat a healthy breakfast and approach the test simply with the attitude to do their very best.

This is simply a way for us to assess where they are so that we can use the results along with our other diagnostic testing to plan for optimum instruction for you child.

Parent Teacher Conferences

Parent Teacher Conferences will be scheduled for Thursday, October 8th from 2:45 until 8:45.

There will be no conferences scheduled between 4:45-5:30. Teacher-requested conferences slips were sent home with the interims with a specified conference time. They were to be signed and returned to the homeroom teacher, indicating if you were able to attend or needed a different time scheduled.

If you did not receive a request for parent teacher conferences but would like to meet with the teacher, you may call the school secretary to get on the schedule. Please keep in mind that conferences are on a tight schedule to fit everyone in. You will be conferencing with all the teachers at one time either with a phone conference or a Google Meet. If you need more time than the 10-15 minutes scheduled, another appointment can be scheduled as needed.

RIMPS

RIMPS are Reading Improvement Plans for individual students. We are in the process of preparing those individualized reading plans for students in Grade 3 based on the results of the diagnostic testing we have been conducting since the early weeks of school. Normally, we have had those forms signed during conferences. Since the conferences will be virtual or through Google Meet, we will need to send those documents home for a parent signature after they have been reviewed. Please make sure they are signed and returned to school as soon as possible as they are required by the state for documentation. Students following the hybrid schedule and 100% remote students who qualify will also be placed on an appropriate reading improvement plan.

DETENTION

Morning Detention is schedule on Tuesday or Wednesday morning from 7:30 to 8:15 at the Intermediate School. Students will enter the building by the front office and after a temperature check proceed with the detention teacher to the classroom. They will be doing classwork, reading or making up missing work. Detentions are given for homework or behavior. Transportation is the responsibility of the parent and students will be scheduled for detention according to their Scarlet or Gray cohort days. If students fail to show up for detention, they will have one chance to reschedule and then will be issued a Saturday detention or In School Suspension.

REMOTE DAYS- ACCOUNTABILITY

Teachers have been focusing each day how to maneuver through the remote day assignments. I have been very impressed with how well organized and easily-accessible the assignments and activities are for the students. When there has been a question about student's capabilities in finding and completing assignments, I have the students to walk me through how they access and complete assignments. They have all been very proficient in working on our digital programs and Google Classroom.

At this point, there is no reason why any student in the Intermediate should not be able to complete remote work and for the most part do it independently. Several of the programs such as Lexia and Reflex Math are to be done daily and require no parental assistance.

Teachers are still reviewing the remote work prior to it being assigned and walking students through step by step. Several of the grades have organized the remote day with a Rainbow planner or checklist com-

plete with a check list.


Here is an example of what one might look like.

Once you click on the planner on the correct remote day, there is a to do



list complete with links to click on. Some of the teachers were even making a video to go along with the weekly plans to verbally explain each day. You see an example below.

What I am stressing is that there is absolutely NO reason for remote work to not be done. As I have previously communicated, we will begin the accountability phase for remote work. Students will be held accountable with a 3 strike system. After the third missed remote assignment, they will be issued a morning detention. This is the same system we previously used with homework.



Specials (Art, Music, PE, Gym) change halfway through the quarter so that during the quarter, students will have two different specials. During the second half of the semester (second quarter), they will complete the cycle and have the other two specials. For the first quarter, the Specials will switch on October 1st. Students will have grades for only two specials on the first quarter report card.

END OF THE QUARTER- EARLY RELEASE


The end of the month also brings the end of the first nine weeks. The first quarter ends on October 30th. Report cards will be sent home the following week.


On the final day of each quarter, the district continues its practice of scheduling an early release date. Here at LIS, our students will be loading the busses around 1:00 p.m. You should plan your child care accordingly for that early release.

In the past, we have scheduled some harvest activities where student's rotated to different classrooms and the early release day concluded with a sweet treat to celebrate. While we may plan some different activities, we will not be doing rotations that increase the student's exposure to areas they normally do not frequent. We will still plan some activities and fun things for them to enjoy and a low-key celebration for both cohorts in

ways that continue to follow our protocols for student wellness and safety. Because of Covid our No Visitor Policy continues to be in effect.
