Welcome Back Students for the Second Semester



January 25th, 2021, many students returned from remote learning to direct instruction in the classroom in all of grades three through five at LIS.

Staff prepared well for our returning students, who also adjusted very well to a new setting. Protocols for our safety during this restrictive time of Covid were reviewed for all students. The photo to the left shows some of their smiling faces!

Many 4th grade students had some schedule shifting that affected their rotation or the time of day they had a particular class scheduled but the teachers were not changed. Keep in mind that we are continually assessing what and how we are instructing all of our students to provide the best learning and support that we can for each and every one.

I commend our staff and students for their flexibility in adjusting things continually, so that our decisions are always based on what is best for our kids!

Parent Teacher Conferences: Conferences are scheduled on Thursday, February 11th from 2:00-9:00. Time slots are still available for parents/guardians to sign up for a conference time using an app called *Sign Up Genius*. The links were emailed in January and included in the January update. They are also linked on the sidebar of this page.

Mid-Year Diagnostics: Students are in the process of taking the Mid-Year Diagnostics in Math & Reading. Reading Diagnostic tests include The Rapid from LEXIA and the I-ready Reading Diagnostics. I-ready will be used for the Math Diagnostic. These tests are given three times a year to help us track the growth of individual students and plan for intervention.

Retention Letters: As listed in our LIS Handbook, we are required to notify parents that if students have failed one or more subjects in the first semester, there is a possibility that retention of the student may have to be considered. If adequate progress is not made during the second semester this would indicate that the student may not be ready for the next grade level. While we realize that these are challenging times in education, the curriculum requirements have been repeatedly adjusted to accommodate the challenges we have been facing in interrupted instruction.

Please know that as we progress through the next few months, we will be monitoring your child's progress and will notify you if we need to take further steps in the retention process. There is ample time for improvement in the next half of the year.

Remote Days: The work assigned for remote days is not homework but a part of our instructional plan. The amount of work that teachers are requiring is minimal and certainly much less than may other districts. As we have stated in previous communication to parents – students are accountable for remote work and it cannot be made up. Due dates are not extended unless students are sick.


All parents have been given information to keep
