GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS 21 CREDITS



<u>Subject</u>	<u>Credits</u>
English 1, 2, 3, 4	4 Credits
Health	.5 Credit
Mathematics (Algebra 2)	4 Credits
Physical Education	.5 Credit
Science	3 Credits (Physical Science, Biology, Advanced Science)
Social Studies	3 Credits (World Studies, US History, US Government)
Fine Arts	1 Credit (One year-long course or two semester courses)
Electives	5 Credits

Any combination of foreign language, fine arts, business, career-technical education, family and consumer science, technology, English, mathematics, science, or social studies not otherwise required.

TESTING REQUIREMENTS



In addition to the course requirements, all students will take End-of-Course (EOC) exams that will replace the OGT. Students enrolled in will take the EOC.

- 1. Algebra 1**
- 2. Geometry**
- 3. Physical Science and/or Biology (2015-2016)**
- 4. American History**
- 5. American Government**
- 6. English 1**
- 7. English 2**

Students taking AP American History and AP American Government can substitute the EOC with AP exam.

1 Point	Limited Level

EOC Scoring

- 1. Scores will range on a scale of 1-5**
 - 2. 3 or above is considered proficient (passing and acceptable)**
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TEST SCORES

Minimum Graduation and Curriculum Requirements	
18 Points	Minimum Graduation Requirement
4 Points	Minimum Mathematics Requirement
4 Points	Minimum English Requirement
6 Points	Minimum Science/Social Studies Requirement

Graduation Points

Each student in the Class of 2018 must meet a minimum total point level in order to graduate. Students must also meet a minimum point level in the various subject areas.



TEST SCORES

Students are not required to score a minimum level on any one test. Instead, they must show they are ready to graduate using a series of tests depending on their academic goals. Starting in the 2015-2016 school year, schools may use the end-of-course tests to replace course finals if schools choose to do so.



TEST QUESTIONS

- 1. There are two parts to the exam: a PBA taken in March and an EOY taken in the Spring.**
 - 2. A student who completed and received credit for a high school course in middle school prior to July 1, 2014 earns three graduation points.**
 - 3. Students who score below proficient on a test may retake it after they receive remediation supports on the material. Students who score proficient or higher on an end-of-course test can retake tests only if, after they've taken all the tests, they still have not met the minimum graduation points to graduate (18 points overall or content area minimums).**
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
