

## 3rd Grade Fall Testing Results

The results from the Fall testing for 3rd grade are in! Students in 3rd grade are still under the 3rd grade Reading Guarantee and are required to meet a particular score to be promoted to the next grade level. There are multiple attempts to show mastery: Fall and Spring ELA testing through the state of Ohio and I-ready diagnostic testing. Currently considering all avenues to meeting the 3rd grade guarantee, 47% of our students have met that target. This is a considerable improvement over the last several years. February conferences will be a time to review where individual students are in relationship to meeting the 3rd grade standard. Currently all grade levels are taking the Winter diagnostics in Math and Reading to assess progress and plan appropriate interventions.


