Testing Tips for Home

- Mark the Testing Dates for your child on the calendar
- Get enough sleep the night before the test
- Eat a nutritious and filling breakfast avoiding high sugar content items as they can make students hyper or unfocused
- Make sure you child is on time (set an extra alarm if needed)
- If child is sick, do not send them to school but notify the school ASAP
- Encourage your child to do his/her best with no pressure
- Use positive language telling students this is their opportunity to show what they have learned and the important thing is growth
- Send a healthy snack
