The library was transformed into CAMP LABRAE and students had a wonderful time.


This year's book fair hit a record with sales and donations alike, so EVERY student was able to leave with a book in hand.

Additionally, because of the record sales, our library will be able to purchase nearly 150 new books for students to check out, plus some needed supplies.




LIS Student Council food drive to benefit area veterans
