This is my first newsletter of the 2023-2024 school year, and as Principal at LIS. I'm new to this position, but I am not new to the district. LIS contains roughly 220 students in grades 3-5. We are currently finding baselines on students in reading and math. LIS is using Acadience Reading this year and we are currently assessing students on those skills. Learning is a skill too, and needs to be practiced by everyone regardless of age. Students learn by practicing the skills that are presented in the classroom in all content areas. Everyone is capable of learning, if they are willing to practice the skills that they need to learn.

LIS does have expectations of the students and our parents. We expect our students to put forth an honest effort and we ask the parents to support that effort. Parents can have access to Progress Book where they check their child's personal progress. I've had many conversations with parents throughout the years concerning homework or lack of homework.
