

DIGITAL SUPPORTS

This year, we are implementing a new digital support program for math in grades K-5, called Symphony Math, which diagnosis student learning needs and prescribes lessons to help students close gaps and progress to grade level. The recommended time for students is 15 minutes a day. We continue our use of Reflex math to work on fact fluency.

Lexia is our digital support program for ELA and also continues to diagnose and plan intervention lessons to help students close gaps and progress towards grade level.

This year we begin Really Great Reading for our new phonics program. Our teachers have already put in hours of training to be able to implement this new program. There is also a digital support for Really Great Reading that is called the **Really Great Reading Playaround.**





EXTENDED LEARNING

It is our intention to offer some after school extended learning opportunities for our students during this school year that would target students who need support in making up some learning loss due to the interruptions in instruction over the last few years due to the pandemic.

More information will be coming to families through further newsletters or email.

If your child is recommended for the extended learning programs, please consider signing up for these programs. while we have the opportunity and the funding.





Principal's Corner

I am writing this as we come to the end of the first week of school. The week went pretty well with just a few minor adjustments. We have been working very consistently to help students make the transition back into school. Many of the students are entering the school setting after quite some time. It is important at the beginning of the school year to clearly establish our expectations, procedures and routines. We continue to utilize our PAX behavior program which focuses on positive behavior choices. These were are reviewed in our PAX Leadership Training stations during the first few days of school.

I visited each classroom to just talk to the students about some general expectations that I wanted to stress at the beginning of the year. This included homework, behavior, technology, dress code and respect for staff and students. If you are new to LIS, we will give the students plenty of time to be redirected and reminded about our expectations before we have to implement consequences that include things like morning detentions. We know it will take concentrated effort and consistency as many students are not used to being in a structured school setting.

We are also still following some special Covid protocols to maintain social distancing, especially during transitions. This also take more supervision and stricter restrictions as we strive to keep everyone safer from the spread of Covid should we have a Covid exposure.

It is so good to see all the students return to in person learning. We have welcomed many students back from virtual learning and also new students to the district. Everyday is very busy as we acclimate new students into our LaBrae School Family.

We continue to provide many opportunities for communication between home and school. Many of the teachers have invited you to join Remind for direct communication between home and school. You have been given information to access Progress Book to track your student's grades and we are soon to invite parents to connect to Google Classroom to receive parent summaries. You will receive monthly newsletters from me and updates as needed through email. I include a video of the newsletter for the condensed version, especially if you don't have time to read a lengthy newsletter but can watch or listen to a video. Communication is vital to our school & family partnership.

I am so grateful to be a part of the LaBrae Family. Our staff has shown amazing vision, creativity, insight, innovation and resilience in adjusting and planning instruction to do the very best we can for each and every child. While this year is still fraught with uncertainty, I can assure you that we work hard every day to make sure that your children are safe, happy and learning. Thank you for partnering with us to walk daily through these challenging times of teaching and learning.
