REMINDER FROM THE NURSE:

These medications can be life saving should your child have a problem at school. Also, Parents be aware we are starting to notice several cases of pink eye in grades K-5.

If you observe the following symptoms please do not send your child to school. If you suspect pink eye consult your child's doctor for appropriate diagnosis & treatment.

- Redness in and around the eye
- Eyes that are puffy & sore
- Itching, burning or stinging eyes
- Watery eyes or discharge from the eyes
- Eyelids that are crusty or stuck together upon waking

Tips for prevention:

- Keep hands away from the eye area
- Wash hands often with soap & water and rinse well
- Never share your eye medications or use someone else's medication
- Use disposable tissues
- Wash towels & bedding in hot water
- Anyone with pink eye should not share towels & washcloths with the rest of the household
