MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parent/Guardians:

This will be the final newsletter for the 2018-19 school year. It's time to move another set of 8th graders to the high school and a new set of 5th graders into the middle school. All state testing for the middle school including make-ups must be completed along with 7th and 8th grade math. We still have to test 6th grade math and 8th grade science.

Every year there are students in danger of retention. These students have been met with and letters have been sent notifying parents. The district offers on-line only classes for students that will be retained. This information will be made available during the last week of school. The high school principal is in charge of running the program, and I am in charge of signing students up. There are still 4 weeks of school left along with opportunities for students to work on passing their present grade level. Unfortunately, this happens every year in nearly every school. I will provide them with the opportunity, but they must be willing to do the work. Our district offers this service relatively cheap in comparison to other vendors.

The 6th grade class will be leaving on May 21st to their annual camping program the Sheldon Calvary Camp. The camp sits on the shore of Lake Erie. Students will depart from school on the 21st and return back to school on the 24th around 1:30 pm. Nearly every one of the 6th graders will attend.
