Dear Parent/Guardians: I would like to thank the community for supporting the 6th grade mum sale. All proceeds have been applied to the 6th grade camping fund. Sixth grade students were recently call to the auditorium to meet with the dental sealant personnel. Student packets were sent home with each student. This is not a mandatory service but an opportunity for every 6th grade student to receive dental sealants on their back molars to prevent tooth decay. Students that have permission will have their teeth sealed during the first week of December. Student interims have been passed out and the 1st 9th weeks will end on October 24th. Students will be dismissed at noon on the 24th. Report cards will be passed out on October 31st. NURSE NEWS

Parents, some students are still missing the following items:

7th graders: proof of a Tdap booster was due on 9-30. Students were given information on this last May. Several notices have been sent home. This is a requirement of the state. Please send in your proof of Tdap, if you have not already done so.

Clinic forms: Any forms regarding asthma/allergies etc. were to be turned in at the beginning of the school year. Students requiring prescription medication (inhaler/epi-pens etc.) are required to have a doctor's order for the medication every year. This is a state and district requirement. Forms were mailed home in June to any student known to have a potential medical issue. A response is required. If you need new forms, your student may pick them up in the clinic.

Influenza: We are approaching flu season. Please monitor your children for the following symptoms:

- Sudden onset of symptoms
- Fever of 100 degrees or higher
- Headache
- Muscle aches
- Cough
- Sore throat Fatigue

Discuss with your child's doctor about getting flu shots for your children. If your child exhibits symptoms of influenza, please indicate this when you report him/her off from school. The Trumbull County Health Department requires schools to report influenza numbers monthly. "Stomach flu" while miserable, is not the same thing as the respiratory influenza tracked by the health department. If your child is having nausea, vomiting, diarrhea with or without a fever, report it as a stomach virus. This helps us keep our tracking and reporting more accurate. Thank you, Mrs. Harper
